



SUMMER CAMP 2018 AT ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE SCHOOL

(General Camp is Open to children entering PK 4 through Gr. 8)

*Part-time children are welcome to stay for a full day for special activities for an additional fee of \$20.

Campers will participate in theme-based activities, arts and crafts, indoor and outdoor play daily. Full day campers will also have daily reading time, and water play!

All campers will need a water bottle, sunscreen, and sneakers; full day campers will also need bathing suit, towel, reading book, and lunch. All items should be labeled!

Week 1 – June 25th - 29th The Big Top (Camp Director: Kathy Creed)

Join us for a week at the circus including face painting, acrobatics, balloon hats, snacks (snow cones, popcorn, soft pretzels) and more. The children will create their own carnival game to share at the camp carnival Friday. On Thursday all the children will enjoy a HUGE slip-and-slide in the playground area.

Week 2 – July 2nd - 6th Learn to Fly (Camp Director: Ann Gochee & Co-Director Terry AuClair-Martin)
(Closed on July 4th)

This week we will be learning about flight and rockets by designing and building our own spaceship with cardboard boxes and our creative genius! Learn how to craft the perfect paper airplane for paper airplane contests. There will also be flight and space games outside, including water rockets!

Week 3 – July 9th - 13th Games, Games & More Games (Camp Director: Terry AuClair-Martin)

Come on down and enjoy an exciting week of games inside and out. Children will have an opportunity to think and act like top secret spies through activities including both indoor and outdoor games. Games will include, but are not limited to card games, board games, soccer, and basketball. Agents will have a chance to try yoga, basic karate, code breaking, and clue hunts. Children will also be able to create their own obstacle/training course.

Week 4 – July 16th - 20th Calling All Campers! (Camp Director: Ann Gochee)

This week we will spend a lot of time outside playing a variety of backyard games! Enjoy KanJam, Ladder Ball, Badminton, water games and more! Campers can learn how to set up a tent and spend some time looking at nature close-up. Clay Creations Week 1, June 25th - June 29th (8:30-11:30 a.m.)
